Sentence Structure

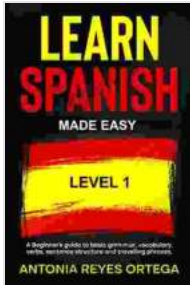
Sentence structure refers to the way that words are arranged to form sentences. The basic sentence structure in English is subject-verb-object.

- **Object:** The object of a sentence is the person, place, or thing that is being affected by the action or event.

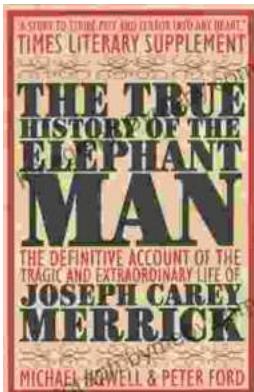

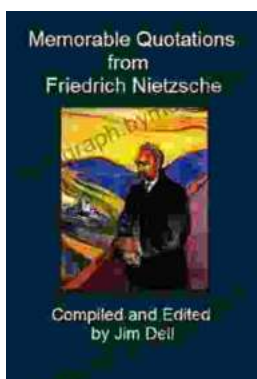
