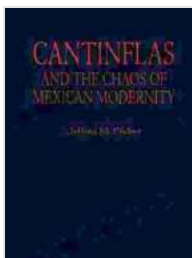


Cantinflas: A Chaotic Symbol of Mexican Modernity

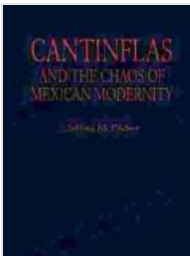
