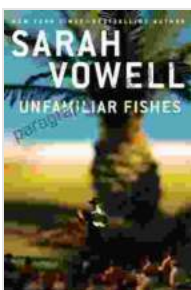


About the Book

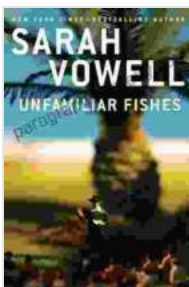
