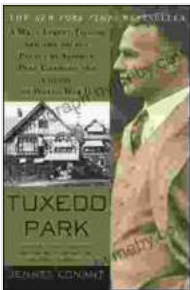


Wall Street Tycoon And The Secret Palace Of Science That Changed The Course Of

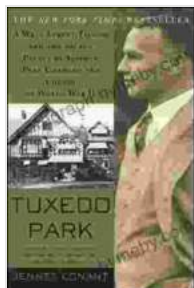

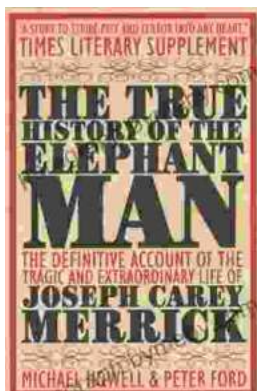


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
