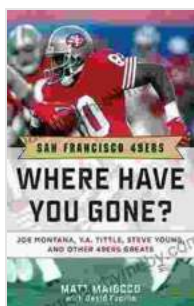

Steve Young



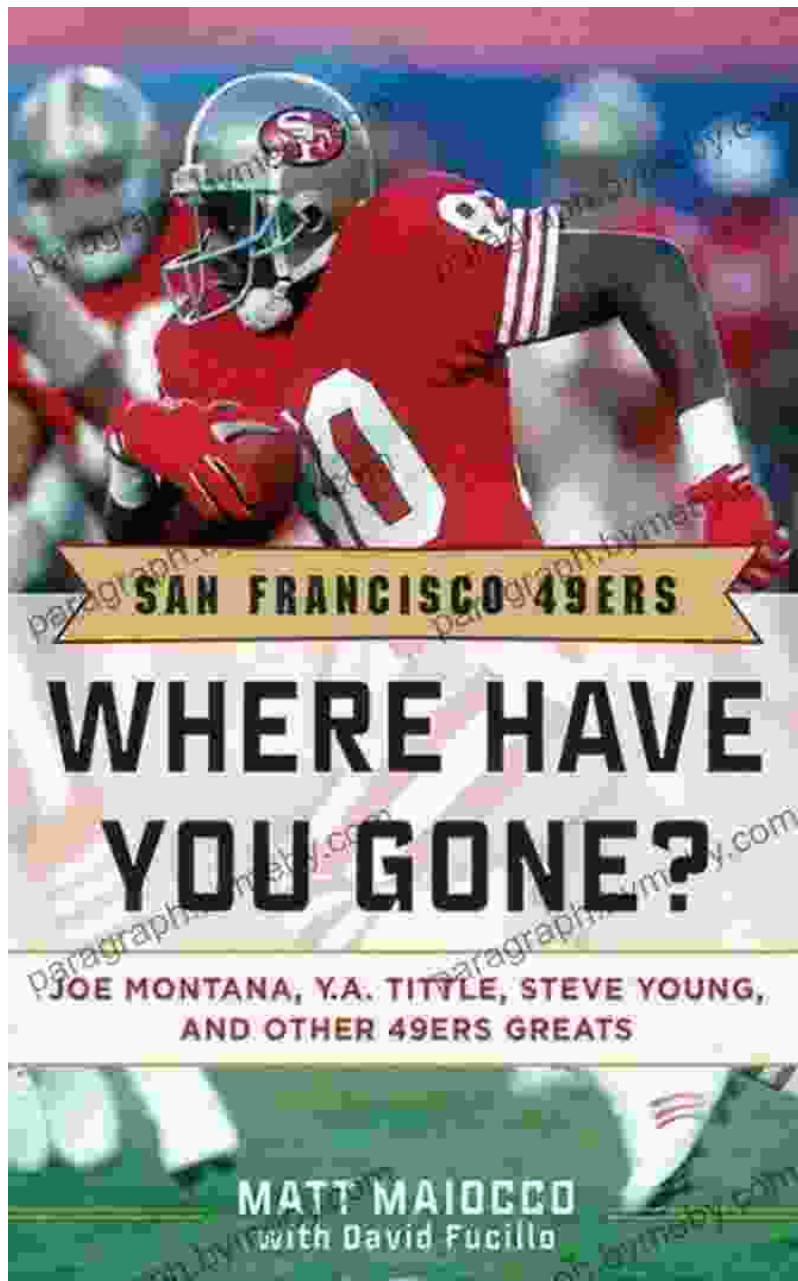

Jerry Rice



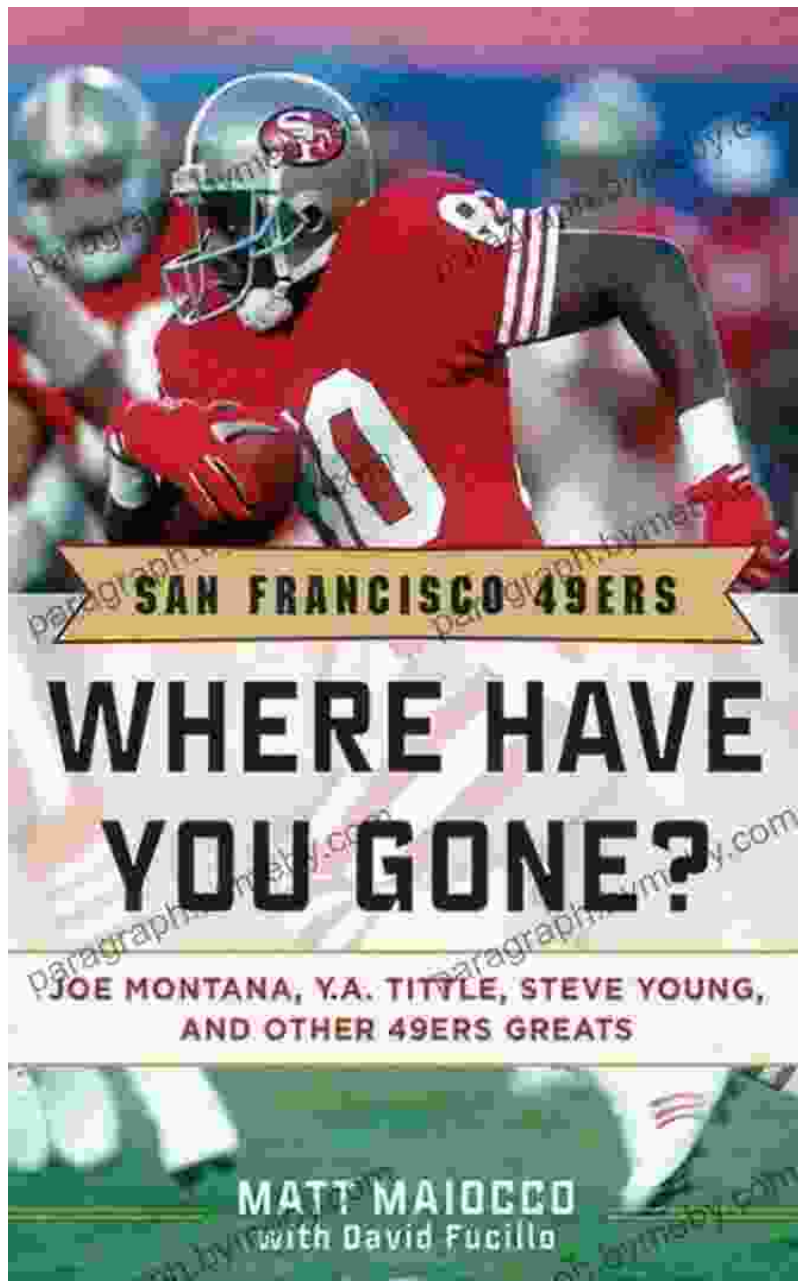

Dwight Clark



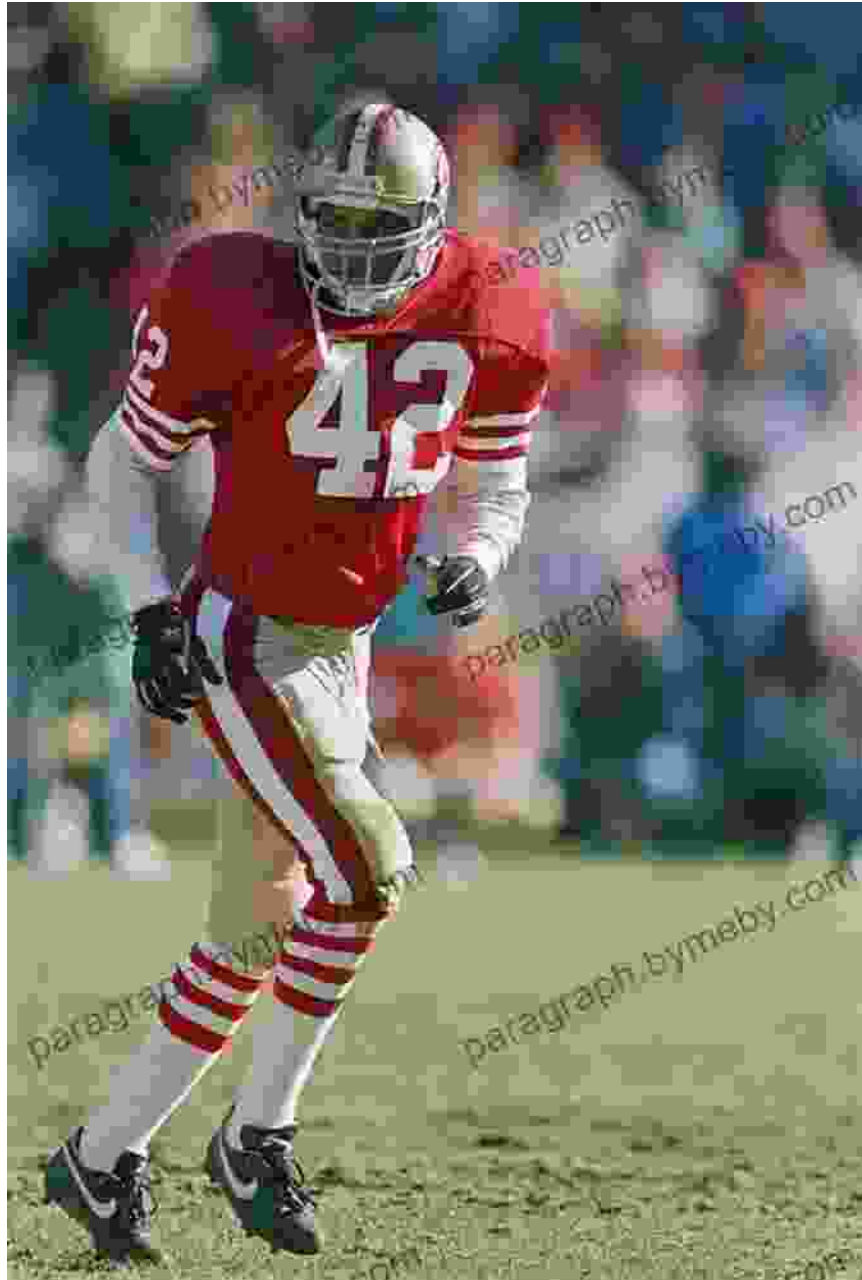

Roger Craig



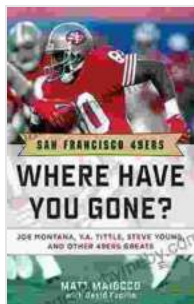

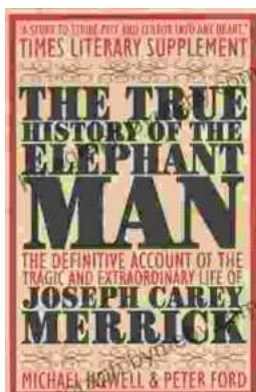
